BA Pensions have closed their offices at Waterside and staff are remaining at home, many being able to work remotely. This will remain in place until the guidance from the Government changes in order to allow people to return to their offices. As a result, BA Pensions are operating a reduced service, giving priority to essential services - processing existing pension payments on time, managing new retirements and making any payments due following the deaths of members and pensioners. All other queries, including new retirement quotes, general scheme enquiries, and transfer out quotations, may take longer than usual. BA Pensions assure members that they are working as quickly as they can and would ask that people do not chase up enquiries as this will slow the team down during an extremely challenging time.

APS Trustee Board Changes

The latest APS Trustee Seasonal Bulletin mentioned a forthcoming reduction in board members from 12 down to 8. The reason is to enable the board to operate more efficiently. ABAP and members of the Trustee board have been meeting to discuss the changes and possible ways to implement them.

Today, 31st March 2020, BA Pensions have written and emailed to APS members outlining the changes and how they will be achieved, by way of an election. ABAP will be communicating separately in more detail to our members who are in APS.

RPI Consultation

On Budget Day, 11th March 2020, the Government launched a 6-week consultation on the future of RPI (retail price index). It now looks inevitable that RPI will be aligned with CPIH (consumer price index + housing costs). The debate will revolve around when that should happen and what steps should be taken to protect the many financial interests that are based around an assumption of RPI.

ABAP will be making a submission to the consultation, assisted by leading actuaries. We will also be providing a briefing for members who can also make their individual submissions and also contact their MPs, to alert them to the implications of this change.

We know from the government's Budget and other announcements that problems arise in any switch from RPI to any lesser indexing basis. In particular, that pension schemes such as ours have accepted contributions on the reasonable expectation (and in our case, an unconditional promise) of an RPI-linked pension. Many pension schemes' investments are RPI linked - the fall in those investments' future values may be greater than net levels of pensions paid to beneficiaries, which could harm the viabilities of some schemes. ABAP is making representations that any such future reductions in pension payments must be compensated, and seeking to publicise this.

While this may seem a trivial matter in the context of current national and world events, the effects of aligning RPI with CPIH are long lasting and will be with us for many years subsequently.
